MEXICO

PASSPORT AND VISA INFORMATION

Your passport needs to be valid for **at least six (6) months** after your journey ends, and should have a minimum of one (1) blank visa page for entry and exit stamps.

Holders of U.S. and Canadian passports are not required to obtain a tourist visa for entry into Mexico for stays of up to 180 days.

Although a passport card may be accepted at the point of entry in Mexico when crossing land borders or entering by sea, for international air travel, a valid passport book is required to enter Mexico.

Under Mexican law, children under age 18 who are traveling unaccompanied or with only one parent must have written, notarized permission to travel from the non-traveling parent(s). Travellers should contact the Mexican Embassy or closest Mexican Consulate for current information.

Citizens of other countries should contact the appropriate consular office for entry requirements pertaining to their journey.

CASH & CREDIT CARDS

U.S. dollars are usually accepted as payment at hotels, restaurants, and shops in major resort areas (although the exchange rate may not be as favorable and change will be given in pesos). Major credit cards are generally accepted in larger shops, hotels and restaurants; however, in more remote areas there may be difficulties in using credit cards, so do not solely rely on them for financial transactions. It is advisable to regularly check your credit/debit card account status to prevent theft and fraudulent use of your card. ATM access is widespread; however, due to safety concerns, make use of ATMs during the day and preferably inside large commercial establishments. Be aware that there is a charge in Mexico to use ATMs and check with your bank to see if there are charges incurred for usage abroad as well.

PACKING LIST

Please use the provided A&K luggage tags, even if your bags already have ID tags. This makes it easier for A&K staff to find and manage your luggage for you.

Clothing

Choose versatile, casual clothing that can be layered if the weather (or level of air-conditioning) requires. Light cotton slacks with long sleeved shirts will offer protection from the sun and protection from mosquitos.

Smart, casual attire is appropriate for evenings. Formal clothing is not necessary.

- Lightweight raincoat or poncho
- Brimmed hat for sun protection
- Personal garments
- Swimwear/cover-up
- Sleepwear

Other Recommended Items

- Face masks and hand sanitizer
- Simple first-aid kit
- Prescriptions and medications (in their original bottles and/or packaging)
- Extra eyeglasses/contact lenses
- Charging cables for electronics
- Sun block and lip balm
- Sunglasses
- Mosquito repellent
- Smartphone
- Global travel adapter

Optional Items

- Small LED flashlight
- Lightweight binoculars
- Foldable walking stick
- Small waterproof daypack

Laundry service is available at most hotels and dry cleaning is available in larger cities. Check costs and return times before using these services.
